They do this by developing safe routes to school, developing after school biking programs and a recycle-eAst-bike program at school. Specific funds would go towards the recycle-eAst-bike portion of the program, and specifically will purchase tools that are needed to fix and repair bicycles.

Funds will be used to purchase materials, supplies and expenses needed to sustain the Peer to Peer program.
4	Teaching the electrical heart through inquiry & technology (EKG)	TC Central High School (Grades 11-12)	Pam Tejkl	\$1,323.00	Requesting funds for 3 Pasco Interfaces (sparklink) and 6 EKG sensors to provide students with real time data collection. Students would be able to use these tools to collect their own data and take the mystery out of the heart cycle. Every student would be able to see their own electrical signal of their heartbeat, and would be able to explore the effects of rest and compare that to the effects of exercise on their heart.
5	Neuroscience... how are teenagers and cockroaches alike?	TC Central High School (Grades 10-12)	Pam Tejkl	\$1,498.00	Requesting funds for 5 neuroscience starter kits, 4 EMG kits, a surgery kit, a care kit and cockroaches. These products will allow students to be like a real neuroscientist and will allow them to perform neurological experiments to learn about electrophysiology so they understand the real world better.
6	Teaching Materials	Traverse City High School (Grades 11-12)	Leah Bagdon McCallum	\$385.00	Requesting funds to purchase books and teaching materials to conduct life skills training for students at TC High School. These classes are designed to provide students with skills to address this need, including budgeting, leadership skills, conflict resolution and people skills. This is a collaborative effort between TC High School and Goodwill Industries of Northern Michigan.
7	ISBV Garden Hoop House	International School at Bertha Vos Elementary	Brenda Mortensen/ Kirk Mallow	\$900.00	The Hoop House project at Bertha Vos began last year as an educational tool toward basic planting and gardening skills, and the concept of perma-culture. They would like to make this program self-sustaining and need to purchase some additional start-up equipment to make this happen.
